Centre County Drug & Alcohol is an agency within Centre County Government whose goal is the prevention and treatment of substance use disorders for Centre County residents.

The agency does not provide treatment, but contracts with various substance abuse outpatient and inpatient providers across the county and, in the case of residential facilities, across the state.

Case management services are provided to anyone with substance use disorders, including assistance with navigating recovery or help with basic needs, such as employment and housing. These services help create stability, which is crucial for sustaining long-term recovery.

For those without insurance, or who are unable to pay for their services, funding may be available for both outpatient and inpatient services. Case managers are on hand to speak to anyone who calls in with questions or is seeking information regarding our services or other local resources.



The Centre County Office of Aging's property tax/rent rebate program supports homeowners and renters across Pennsylvania. The program provides a rebate ranging from \$380 to \$1,000 to adults aged 65 and older, people with disabilities 18 and older and widows and widowers aged 50 and older, with a household income of \$45,000 or less annually.

Applications for the 2023 rebates are due by June 30, 2024. If extra funds are available, the deadline will be extended to Dec. 31.

This service is available to all Centre County residents.

Various agencies and programs are available to help offset transportation costs: transportation for residents aged 60

or older is funded by the Centre County Office of Aging and PennDOT; transportation for medical purposes for eligible Medical Assistance clients is funded through their MA plan; transportation for residents who qualify for the Persons with Disabilities program can ride at reduced rates.

Other outside agencies can help fund trips for their clients. Residents without programs to offset transportation costs can pay the full fare rates.

Clients must be registered before scheduling transportation. All trips must be scheduled in advance.

Every day, someone in Centre County faces a housing crisis. Housing Transitions is here to help. Centre House is our onsite 12 bed shelter that is the ONLY family shelter in Centre County. In addition to shelter services, we provide several supportive housing services: Rapid Rehousing, Transitional Housing and Permanent Supportive Housing.

Rapid Rehousing is meant to make the amount of time a person is homeless as brief as possible. Clients are offered both financial assistance and case management for a period of time to ensure they can build a strong foundation that will help them remain housed long term.

Our two transitional units act as an extension to our shelter giving people the independence to live in an apartment while working on goals to obtain their own lease. Permanent Supportive Housing is designed to assist those with more intense needs who have been chronically homeless as well as have a diagnosed mental and/or physical disability.

Our goal is to end homelessness in Centre County.
