



BROCKERHOFF HOUSE ON THE DIAMOND IN HISTORIC BELLEFONTE

The Brockerhoff House is managed by the Centre County Housing Authority. This is a HUD subsidized Elderly property. Residents are selected through a waiting list and must meet the criteria of the Tenant Selection Plan as required by HUD.

The Historic Brockerhoff House is a 33 apartment, independent living facility located on the diamond in downtown Bellefonte. We offer 28 - one bedroom apartments and 5 studio apartments. Our residents enjoy access to an onsite



laundry facility, library, community room with kitchen and balcony, covered porch, first floor lobby, on-site mail delivery and pick up, elevator and locked entry doors

with key fob and code access. Property Management and Maintenance are onsite with an after-hours on-call Maintenance service. Electric, heat, water, sewer and refuse are included. Rent is 30% of adjusted gross income and varies by household.

The Brockerhoff House offers easy walking access to many restaurants, shops, banks, professional services, and CATA bus stops. We are at the heart of the action for community events such as the Bellefonte Cruise, Arts and Crafts Fair, Victorian Christmas, and many more.





Crestside Terrace is a non-smoking facility and is a 5 story brick building with 40 apartments. All utilities are included in the rent except for phone, cable, and internet. The Centre County Van service is available and a CATA Bus stop is within walking distance. Free off-street private parking is provided for tenants.

Crestside Terrace offers an on-site laundry room. The tenants enjoy a community room where they work on jigsaw puzzles, play bingo, share magazines and books, have potluck meals and socialize. There is a garden, flower beds, benches, picnic table, and a sitting area for our residents' enjoyment. Full-time maintenance is provided.

Centre County Children and Youth is dedicated to the task of assuring a safe home environment free from abuse, neglect and exploitation for all Centre County children referred to the agency. Centre County Children and Youth Services is responsible for these tasks with the authority of the court. Child welfare services are designed to protect children from abuse or neglect and assist families in staying together when safe and appropriate. When it is not safe for children to remain with their family, the agency, along with the courts, provides a temporary home for the child until reunification or permanency occurs.

(CCCHS). Established in 1968, CCCHS is a nonprofit organization that provides collaboration, networking and the promotion of volunteerism throughout the county.


As an organization, we believe that meeting human service needs requires an interdisciplinary knowledge base and commitment to improve the overall quality of life for our shared community.

Long-term Nursing Home Care Requires a Plan

TRADITIONAL MEDICARE AND NURSING HOME CARE

Medicare coverage for nursing home care is short term (known as subacute rehabilitation). Most

Medicare recipients believe they will receive 100 days of rehabilitation after a serious illness or injury. In order to qualify for this benefit, the Medicare recipient must be admitted to the hospital (not to be confused with observation; observation is not admittance). The average subacute rehabilitation stay is two to three weeks before the coverage is terminated. It is often a surprise to families when they receive a Medicare letter of non-coverage shortly after arrival at the facility.

FACILITY MEDICAID

Many families have been told by the nursing home that they can obtain retroactive eligibility for Medicaid. To obtain retroactive eligibility, you must be financially

www.interfaithhumanservices.org 814-234-7731 eligible for Medicaid from your date of admission or date that insurance/Medicare stops paying.

Medicaid applications are submitted directly to the County Assistance Office. Once received, a caseworker will be assigned to your application. This caseworker will pull out any withdrawals, checks or deposits in excess of \$500 and request explanation, as Medicaid guidelines only allow for a maximum of \$500 a month in gifting within the previous five years.

Every Medicaid recipient has an income liability to the nursing home each month. Medicaid will provide coverage of the monthly nursing home bill for services over the income liability. The income liability will look different for every Medicaid recipient. From gross income, deducting \$45 (which every Medicaid recipient can keep) and deducting Medicare and supplemental health insurance premiums — the remainder of the Medicaid recipient's income will go to the nursing home each month.

The Centre County Office of Transportation is committed to providing reliable transportation throughout the county. This service is available to all Centre County residents.


Various agencies and programs are available to help offset transportation costs: transportation for residents aged 60 or older is funded by the Centre County Office of Aging and PennDOT; transportation for medical purposes for eligible Medical Assistance clients is funded through their MA plan; transportation for residents who qualify for the Persons with Disabilities program can ride at reduced rates.

Other outside agencies can help fund trips for their clients. Residents without programs to offset transportation costs can pay the full fare. Clients must be registered before scheduling transportation. All trips must be scheduled in advance.

Each client is assigned a free personal nurse that visits them in their home from pregnancy through the child's second year of life. To qualify for NFP services, families must be within 235% of the Federal Income Poverty Guidelines, be a first-time mom and enter the program before or during the 28th week of pregnancy.
